The Postgraduate College, Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria, invites postgraduate students, researchers, academics, professionals, policymakers, industry actors, and development stakeholders to submit abstracts and full papers for the 3rd Biennial Postgraduate Conference. The conference is designed to provide a platform for postgraduate scholars and researchers to present innovative research findings, share knowledge, receive scholarly feedback, build academic networks, and contribute to national, regional, and global development discourse.

Conference Theme

Innovative Postgraduate Research for Sustainable Development in the Era of Artificial Intelligence

Conference Rationale

The rapid advancement of Artificial Intelligence, digital technologies, and emerging knowledge systems is reshaping education, research, industry, governance, health, agriculture, infrastructure, finance, and society. In this changing context, postgraduate research must not only advance knowledge but also provide practical solutions to development challenges. This conference, therefore, seeks to promote high-quality postgraduate research that addresses sustainable development, innovation, digital transformation, institutional strengthening, knowledge commercialization, and societal transformation.

Conference Objectives

The objectives of the conference are to:

1. provide a scholarly platform for postgraduate students and researchers to present ongoing and completed research;
2. promote interdisciplinary dialogue on innovation, sustainable development and Artificial Intelligence;
3. strengthen postgraduate research quality, academic writing, publication and knowledge dissemination;
4. encourage research collaboration among universities, research institutes, industry, government and development partners;
5. promote the application of research findings to national development challenges;
6. expose postgraduate scholars to peer review, academic critique and research communication; and
7. generate scholarly outputs including a book of abstracts, conference proceedings and policy-relevant recommendations.

Categories of Participation

Participants may submit abstracts and papers for any of the following categories:

- Oral paper presentation
- Poster presentation
- Doctoral research presentation
- Master's research presentation
- Panel contribution
- Innovation or research exhibition

Guidelines for Abstract Submission

Abstracts should be prepared according to the following guidelines:

- Title: not more than 20 words
- Author names and institutional affiliations should be clearly stated
- The corresponding author's email and phone number should be provided
- Abstract length: between 250-300 words
- Keywords: 4–6 keywords

Abstract should clearly indicate the background, objective, methodology, major findings or expected findings, conclusion, and contribution to knowledge or development.

- Font: Times New Roman, 12-font size
- Line spacing: 1.15
- File format: Microsoft Word document

Guidelines for Full Paper Submission

Full papers should be submitted after abstract acceptance and should follow the prescribed conference format. Papers should normally include:

- Title
- Author name(s) and affiliation(s)
- Abstract
- Introduction
- Materials and Methods/Methodology
- Results and Discussion
- Conclusion and Recommendations
- Acknowledgments, where applicable
- References

Full papers should not exceed 10 pages, including references, tables, and figures, unless otherwise specified by the Conference Technical Subcommittee.

Review and Selection Process

All submitted abstracts and papers shall be subjected to academic peer review by appointed reviewers. Submissions will be assessed based on:

- relevance to the conference theme or sub-themes;
- originality and contribution to knowledge;
- clarity of objectives;
- appropriateness of methodology;
- quality of analysis and presentation;
- significance of findings;
- policy, practical or theoretical relevance; and
- adherence to submission guidelines.

Accepted abstracts will be assigned to appropriate thematic sessions for oral or poster presentation.

Expected Conference Outputs

The expected outputs of the conference include:

- conference programme booklet;
- book of abstracts;
- peer-reviewed conference proceedings;
- conference communique;
- awards for outstanding presentations;
- strengthened postgraduate research networks; and
- recommendations for policy, practice and future research.
